Applicants who are not admitted to their applied program(s), will be considered for respective alternative choice(s), if they have indicated such preference on their application forms, and can fulfil the subject requirements of respective alternative choice(s).

HOW TO APPLY Your online application should include:

- Maximum two application choices, with indication of your alternative choice(s), if any
- Copies of national ID card and/or travel document
- A personal statement and school reports from grade 10 onwards
- Proof of English language proficiency
- Public examination result certificates, if any
- Proof of significant prizes and/or awards, if any
- Nomination of an academic referee and/or counselor
- Application fee of HKD 450 (~USD58)

To be admitted to HKUST undergraduate programs, you should meet the specific subject requirements of respective application choices and the followings:

GENERAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Graduation from high school; and one of the following qualifications

American Patterned System (SAT/AP)	SAT total score of 1,290 or above; or SAT Reasoning Test with a combined score of 1,800 or above (Pre-March 2016, in one sitting); or ACT Plus Writing with composite score of 27 or above; and (i) American College Board Advanced Placement (AP) in three subjects, each with a score of 3 or above; or (ii) Three SAT Subject Tests, each with a score of 600 or above
British Patterned System (GCEAL/IAL)	Passes in at least three Advanced Level (AL) subjects in the GCEAL/IAL examinations; or Cambridge Pre-U Diploma; or BTEC National Level 3 Extended Diploma Applicants may present Cambridge Pre-U Principal courses in place of AL subjects
International Baccalaureate	IB Diploma

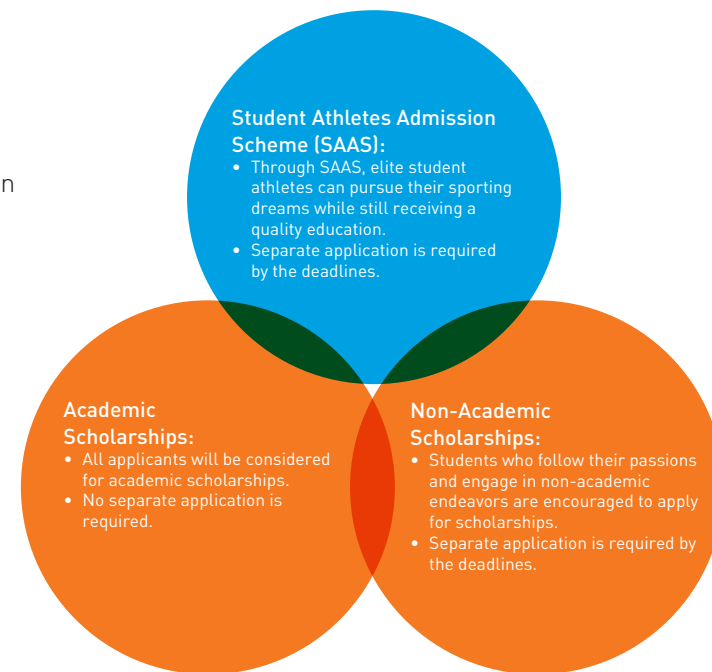
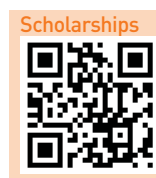
At HKUST, we award different kind of recognitions to support students in chasing their dreams.

* Local students are provided with at least one term of university accommodation in their first year of study in HKUST upon completion of applications. Non-local students are provided with university accommodation in their first two years of study in HKUST. Students are advised to plan ahead to arrange off-campus accommodation thereafter and should expect to pay HKD5,000 to HKD7,000 per month to cover their accommodation costs. * Non-local students refer to students holding:
